Deputy Mayor Holman encouraged the Junior Council to form a mission statement for their bullying campaign to share at the next meeting.

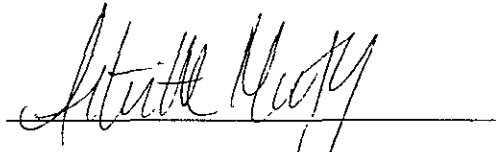
IV. ADJOURNMENT
