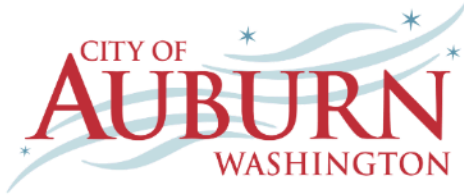

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. Approval of January 6th Park Board Minutes

The Park Board approved the January 6th, 2026 Park Board Minutes.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Naming the Downtown Park Plaza Area (Policy 1130) - Parks Director Julie Krueger

Parks Director Julie Krueger talks about what the Parks Department had done previously with the Postmark Center for the Arts when naming the facilities. The Parks Department would like to use the same type of model in naming the Downtown Park Plaza. The board was presented with Policy 1130. There are 35,000 people on an e-blast list, and social media, as well as utilizing the communications department to create a banner and a QR code to gather survey answers. Board member Wayne Osborne asks how the parks department would narrow down ideas. Councilwoman Cheryl Rakes asked if the Auburn Downtown Cooperative and the Business Improvement Area (BIA) could receive the emails so they could forward the survey to others, specifically downtown businesses.

Park Planning Manager Thaniel said there will be bids coming back soon for the downtown plaza. John Fleming (artist commissioned) presented to council about the art that will be going into the downtown plaza.

B. 2025 Capital Project Recap and 2026 Look-Ahead - Park Planning Manager Thaniel Gouk

Parks Planning Manager Thaniel Gouk goes through the Parks Capital Project 2025 Recap and 2026 project look ahead. This presentation is similar to what was brought to City Council recently. The first project was the completion of the Postmark Lower Level area. The grand opening was in April 2025. Grant funded, and state capital funded as well. Demolished the building at 125 E Main St, adjacent to the Theater site. The building was purchased in 2024. Soos Creek Botanical Gardens in Lea Hill, applied for

a \$2.1 million grant from CFT to purchase the Soos Creek Botanical Gardens. Board Member Wayne Osborne suggested a field trip in the summer to tour the Soos Creek gardens. At the Les Gove Splash Pad, the state offers grants for manifold and valve replacements, and the parks department received \$150,000 in funds from RCO to replace such. There is a new above-ground system for the Les Gove Splash pad.

Wayne asks if it's freeze-proof, but Thaniel states that they blow the lines. The Bocce courts had the oyster shell surfacing replaced, there was quite a bit of moss and grass along with drainage issues. This was funded with King County Park Levy Funds and Park Impact fees. Yolanda states that Salvador (Bocce Club President) has been very happy with the improvements. Cedar Lanes Park had the dirt pump track completed by Evergreen Mountain Bike (contractors who did the park). Along with Cedar Lanes, the Washington Recreation & Parks Association awarded the City of Auburn Parks for the Spotlight Awards of 2024. Yolanda asks about the muddy paths, Thaniel states there are not plans yet. Installed artwork from the Sculpture gallery purchase award at Les Gove Park, moved existing public artwork from B-Street Plaza. Councilwoman Cheryl Rakes asks if a business could pay to have the (rotating) artwork, Parks Director Julie states that because the artwork is on public right-of-way and it will likely get rotated out.

Grant from 4cultures to replace the caretakers (mobile) home at Mary Olsen Farm. Parks Director Julie states she signed the contract today for a new caretaker and will hopefully have them start next week. Completed the 10th Addition burial site at the Mountainview Cemetery. About 32,000 square feet of new irrigated grass. The cemetery is part of an enterprise fund, not the general fund and that's where those funds come from to allow the cemetery to have the funds.

2026 projects:

-Civil layout of the new downtown park. Conservation futures require 80% to be green space, as the RCO is funding this project. There is an unfinished alleyway between the Postmark and the New Theater, which will use the same landscaping (one project). John Fleming Gathering Tree (art piece for the Downtown Plaza). This process started with John 6 months ago, went through an art selection committee and then went to the Arts Commission and then to City Council. Council approved the resolution for the concept (02/02/2026).

-Veteran's Park Paver Replacement at the Veteran's Memorial Park. Parks is going to meet with the American Legion to update.

-Jacobsen Tree Farm, new park development. Located on Lea Hill. Going to apply for RCO grants (state grants). 2026 RCO grant cycles begin in Spring.

-King County Park Levy Funds 2026-31 was approved by voters in 2025. Auburn is expected to receive \$934k per year from the levy funds. The funds are less restricted and more flexible and able to be used for capital projects/maintenance projects. Turfing the ball fields, as this will also create revenue.

C. PROS Plan Update - Park Planning Manager Thaniel Gouk

-PROS Update: As it's been reviewed, there are items that need to be fixed, along with updating capital Facilities Plans to better represent new King County Park Levy funds

for projects. Parks Director Julie states we will bring it in pieces to the park board, then present to the planning commission, and then it will be taken to Council.

-Facilities Master Plan, study started in 2021 which covers Public Works, Police, and Parks. For Parks, the study looks at repairing GSA and adding on to the Parks Maintenance shop. Renovating the crew space and adding a new cored shop and storage area. Director Julie says these are preliminary plans. R St Property will have added crew space, remodel the shop, and secure the site with fencing options. More to come with this. Public works is managing the Facilities Master Plan. We are in Phase 2 of a 3 phase process.

Deposit & Registration Policy

For the convenience of reserving a spot in a camp, you may make a \$25 deposit per camp. Deposits are non-refundable and non-transferable to other camps or classes. All deposits are applied to the total session fee. Full fees are due by the end of day Thursday, ten days prior to each session. Balances will automatically be scheduled to be paid by credit/debit card or electronic transfer provided by you at time of registration. If your full payment is not received ten days prior to the start of camp, your spot will no longer be reserved, and your deposit is forfeited. Refunds or credits are not issued for single full days or partial days missed. Please call the Parks Arts & Recreation Department at 253-931-3043 or visit auburnwa.gov/parkspolicy for full refund policy.

Resident Discount Fee

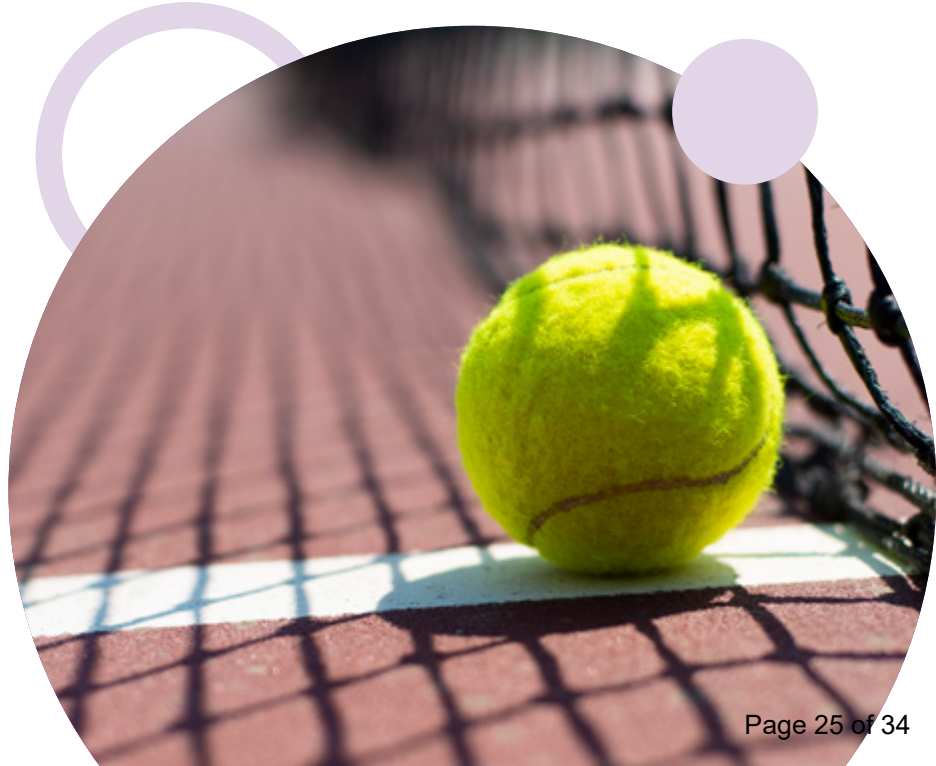

Section 5000 Natural Resources
Subject 100 Vegetation Maintenance
Title 10 Tree Maintenance

PURPOSE: To establish clear procedures and standards for the management of trees within Auburn’s park system, ensuring that trees are planted, maintained, and removed in a manner that supports a healthy environment and strong communities. Residents living next to properties within the City’s park system recognize and understand the importance of trees and the inherent risk of doing so.

POLICIES:

- A. Tree management decisions will prioritize public safety, park function, and tree health.
- B. Trees will not be removed, trimmed or pruned for private views, aesthetics, or debris complaints.
- C. Trees will not be trimmed or pruned solely for purpose of trees overhanging onto or over private property.
- D. Residents may prune branches or roots to their property line if no harm is done to City trees and the work is consistent with applicable City codes.
- E. Residents shall not trespass onto public property to remove or otherwise alter trees.
- F. If a private property owner believes a tree on City park property is hazardous or should be removed, they may request that the City conduct a visual assessment of the tree. The City, at its discretion, may perform the assessment and inform the requestor of its decision. If the private property owner disagrees with the City’s assessment, or if the City denies the assessment request, the owner may hire an ISA-certified arborist to provide a written assessment. The City will review the arborist’s report and make the final determination regarding whether the tree is hazardous and may be removed or must be preserved.
- G. If the City reviews the arborist’s report and determines that tree trimming or removal is warranted, the City will complete the approved work. If the City does not approve of the work, no trimming or removal will be performed by the City.
- H. The City will make every effort to clean up tree trimmings resulting from approved work. Any debris remaining on private property after the work is completed is the responsibility of the property owner to remove.
- I. Responsibility for fallen trees, branches, etc. rests with the property where the tree or branch lands.
