My name is Kechi Amaefule, and I serve as the Executive Director of Mothers Impacting Lives Every day (MILE), a South King County nonprofit that provides mentorship, leadership development, and supportive services for youth and families.

We are currently reviewing the upcoming Human Services funding opportunities and are very interested in applying to both the City of Auburn and the City of Federal Way. Before moving forward, I wanted to confirm whether it is permissible for our organization to submit proposals to both jurisdictions, provided that the proposals are distinct and designed to serve residents of each respective city.

For example, we are exploring the possibility of proposing a youth leadership and wellness program through our OvercomHer mentoring initiative that would specifically recruit and serve girls living in Auburn, while submitting a separate proposal to Federal Way that focuses on programming designed Women experiencing and/or survivors of DV for Federal Way residents.

Our goal is to ensure that we remain fully aligned with each city's funding guidelines while expanding access to services for youth and women in the communities we serve.

Could you please advise whether submitting separate, city-specific proposals would be allowable within the current funding cycle?
