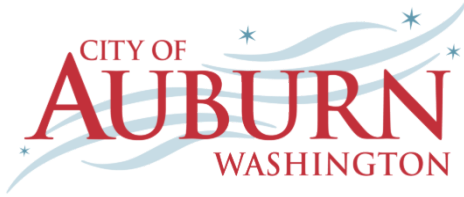

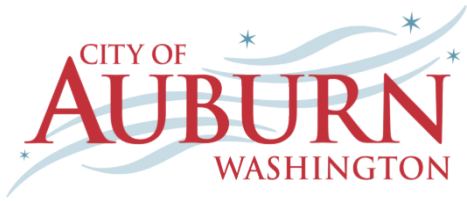

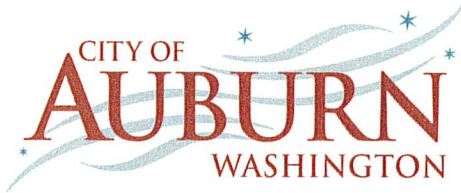

My name is Kechi Amaefule, and I serve as the Executive Director of Mothers Impacting Lives Every day (MILE), a South King County nonprofit that provides mentorship, leadership development, and supportive services for youth and families.

We are currently reviewing the upcoming Human Services funding opportunities and are very interested in applying to both the City of Auburn and the City of Federal Way. Before moving forward, I wanted to confirm whether it is permissible for our organization to submit proposals to both jurisdictions, provided that the proposals are distinct and designed to serve residents of each respective city.

Conflict of Interest Policy
2026

PURPOSE

The purpose of the conflict-of-interest policy is to protect The City of Auburn Human Services Committee's interest when it is contemplating the recommendation of Human Services funds to applicants that might benefit the private interest of a committee member. This policy is intended to supplement but not replace any applicable state and federal laws governing conflict of interest applicable to non-profit and charitable corporations.

PROCEDURES

Distribution of Policy and Procedures

This policy shall be presented and discussed annually for the information and guidance of committee members and City of Auburn Human Services staff who are serving or employed by the applicant. Any new committee member shall be advised by the Human Services Chair of this policy and furnished with a disclosure statement upon undertaking the duties of the Human Services Committee.

Duty to Disclose

In connection with any actual or possible conflict of interest, an interested person must disclose the existence of any relationship with any nonprofit applying for City of Auburn Human Services funds and be given the opportunity to disclose all material facts to the members of committee.

Procedures for addressing a conflict of interest

Committee members serving or employed by any of the applicants of Human Services funds to which a grant is to be considered will not rate the application, will retire from the room during the course of the discussion, and will not participate in the deliberation nor vote on the matter.

Violations of the Conflicts of Interest Policy

1. If the committee has reasonable cause to believe a member has failed to disclose actual or possible conflicts of interest, it shall inform the member of the basis for such belief and afford the member an opportunity to explain the alleged failure to disclose.
2. If, after hearing the member's response and the committee determines the member has failed to disclose an actual or possible conflict of interest, it shall take appropriate disciplinary and corrective action.

RECORD KEEPING

Annually the following will be collected:

1. The names of the persons who disclosed or otherwise were found to have an actual or possible conflict of interest, and the nature of the conflict.
2. A signed statement from each committee member which affirms such person:
 - a. Has received a copy of the conflicts of interest policy,
 - b. Has read and understands the policy,
 - c. Has agreed to comply with the policy
